MINISTRY & LIFE PERSPECTIVES



In today's Gospel, when Jesus says, "Whoever wishes to save their life will lose it," he invites us to "go all in" and bet everything we have. If we hold back we will lose, but if we let go, we will win. It's a high-stakes "game." All eternity is riding on our willingness to bet our whole life on Jesus.

Going all in is to deny ourselves. Some translations say forget yourself. To forget yourself is to think beyond oneself. For example, can you refuse to take the easy way of self seeking, self-gratification, self-interest? Can you deny your thoughts of getting good things for yourself? Or of evil for your "enemies? Can we stop you from lusting after people and things? Or feelings of revenge towards those who have wronged us? Can you empty yourself for the good of another even when you are tired or frustrated or don't like the other person who is in need?

To forget yourself is to let go of control. A mother shares this story: "My son, who although he is only fifteen, is built like a tank - standing several inches taller than me and outweighing me by close to a hundred pounds. Let's just say he was a real good choice for the strong, back seat rider in the kayak. We were instructed that the backseat kayak occupant was to use their paddles to steer the kayak, while the front person just keeps on paddling. And as we found out, once we got out on the open sea, this trip was going to require constant steering and readjustment of our position in order not to lose sight of our destination.

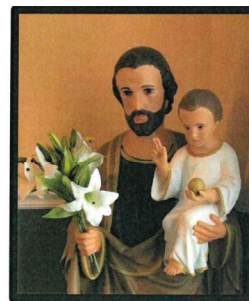
This really should not have been a problem, only I refused to just let go and allow my son to take control. I would constantly try to steer our kayak and change our course. I thought that I was in a better position to judge where we should be going. Consequently, my son and I would be fighting each other with our opposite moves. He finally said to me "Mom, unless you stop trying to steer, I cannot do my job".

It is God's desire to lead each one of us. To plainly show us his will for our lives and lead us toward the best decision in every circumstance. It's so easy to sidestep God's Word and commands in favor of doing our own thing. We may really love the Lord, with a true desire to serve him and obey him, but with a stubborn streak that deludes us into thinking that his word does not apply to us or to our particular situation. When that happens, we have taken over the control of our lives (the kayak) and we will now go in circles - getting nowhere with a whole lot of effort!

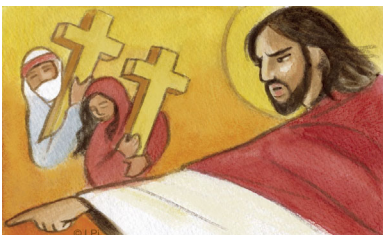

Can You Walk the Walk?

I've met and talked with enough people to feel confident that if you polled 100 fallen-away Catholics about why they didn't want anything to do with the Church, the term "accountability" would pop up in almost all of their answers.

And to be fair, a lack of accountability isn't just a Catholic problem. Talking the talk but not walking the walk has been a shortcoming handed down throughout the ages, across all creeds and nationalities.

Loving our neighbor, welcoming the stranger, clothing the naked, feeding the poor — it all sounds fantastic, especially when we're the ones saying it. But the doing — well, that's a different story, isn't it? We would do well to remember that Christ calls one of his best friends "Satan" when Peter tries to convince Jesus to stray from his destiny.

Have you ever been called Satan by one of your good buddies? I'll bet it's not a great feeling. But think about what Peter was doing. He had just said, "You are the Christ." And now, mere moments later, he's saying: "Don't say these things. Don't say you're going to suffer. Don't say you'll be killed."

He was telling Christ to squander what the Lord had given him. He was telling him that having faith was fine, but being faithful? It's just a little too hard. God has a destiny for you, too, and He's asking you to be open to it. Maybe it's not in your comfort zone. Maybe you don't think you can do it.

Lord, give us faith — but help us, also, to do the work.

BUDGET UPDATE

In last month's bulletin, we gave an end-of-July report on how we had started the fiscal year, especially in light of the deficit budget we are operating with this year. The Finance Council is discussing how to address that trend. Meanwhile, here is an update as of the end of August.

With \$74,314 in regular giving, August brought in almost \$10,000 more than July's total of \$64,734, due in part to a fifth Sunday and the gradual increase in attendance. Seven weeks into the fiscal year, our target to date is \$166,500. In that period, regular giving is \$139,048, or \$27,452 behind budget. This does not include any Festival financials, which are still in preparation awaiting final bills.

We will continue to offer periodic updates. As you know, meeting our budgeted income is essential to continuing to offer the variety of programming and services that allow our parish to meet people's needs and remain vibrant. Thank you for the many ways you support Sacred Heart.

The Hailstorm of August 28

I was out in the garage when the storm came through that Saturday morning just a few minutes but quite memorable! Like many of you, we have had many contacts from contractors but have made no decisions. We are insured by Catholic Mutual and their contracted local adjusters were here a couple of times to assess damages to all of our buildings. Fortunately, we suffered no broken glass although some plastic frame pieces were damaged, along with dents to siding and shingles. The adjusters will send their report to Catholic Mutual who will review and assess what claims they will fund. This will take some weeks. Be assured that we have not found any damage that compromises our safety, functionality, or structures. Thank you for your patience.

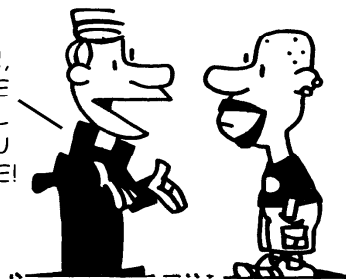
